- 6 Exhibitors must provide their own vases for those classes where vases are not provided but the Committee cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage thereto.
- 7 Any protest or objection made IN WRITING will be considered by the Committee but their decision on this or any other matter pertaining to the Show shall be final.
- 8 Prize monies not collected on the afternoon of the Show will be repaid into funds.
